AAA PTA Receives Grant Award for community festival, *Dance Africa*

Second Annual Dance Africa workshop to be held on National Dance Day in Huntsville, Alabama

Huntsville, Alabama – The Academy for Academics and Arts PTA (AAA PTA) is pleased to announce the receipt of a grant from the Support the Arts License Tag grant program. This grant signified that AAA PTA provides programs of artistic quality, serves the needs of the community, and demonstrates high-level administration standards, as well as enhancing education of students at all levels. This year, AAA PTA has partnered with the Alabama Dance Council to host this unique community event.

“The Alabama Dance Council (ADC) is excited to partner with AAA PTA for Dance Africa,” says Kerri-Noelle Humphrey, ADC Program Director. “Events like this not only build the visibility of dance but also broaden who gets to do it. We believe all students should have access to high-quality, meaningful arts experiences. Dance Africa will certainly provide that.”

This grant is made possible through funding from an annual appropriation from the Alabama State Council on the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts. This public support allows AAA PTA to demonstrate the importance of arts as a component for quality of life in Alabama.

The grant award will fund the second annual Dance Africa festival, an all-day FREE dance festival. We expect our audience to be in the region of 150+ students. The event will be held on Saturday, September 17th, from 9:00 am to 4:30 pm at 4800 Sparkman Drive, Huntsville, AL and is open to north Alabama students grades 3-8.
